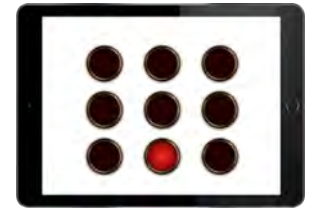


As research and education on concussions continue to grow, **chiropractors** can fill an important gap as concussion care providers.

Sideline Assessments

Chiropractors may be on the sidelines of sports games and practices to triage, make removal from activity decisions, and refer for further assessment.

They may use **ImPACT Quick Test** - a brief, neurocognitive test battery that can be administered in 5-minutes on the sidelines or point of care to assist with removal from activity decisions. It also includes the ability to administer and record the Vestibular Ocular Motor Screening (**VOMS**) and Balance Error Scoring System (**BESS**) tests.

Concussion Evaluations

Chiropractors may also be involved in concussion evaluation, differential diagnosis, and return to activity decisions (in some states).

They may use **ImPACT** (for patients ages 12-80) or **ImPACT Pediatric** (for patients 5-11) - 20-minute computerized assessments that produce a detailed clinical report with objective measurements of visual and verbal memory, reaction time, and processing speed.
