ImPACT Patient Journey



Patient completes an ImPACT baseline test prior to sustaining a head injury. In the absence of a baseline test, your healthcare provider may use normative values based on your demographic.

Lab, doctor's office, walk-in clinic, at home

Patient finds a trained healthcare provider who can administer an ImPACT post-injury test.

Administered in-person in a lab, doctor's office, walk-in clinic, or remotely via telemedicine

Healthcare provider assigns a clinical profile and creates a tailored treatment plan.

Clinical profiles: cognitive, vestibular, ocular, migraine, anxiety

Patient is monitored as they progress through concussion treatment until they are cleared for return to activity by their healthcare provider.

Return to daily activities, return to work, return to driving, return to learn, return to sports

Patient gets a head injury and is experiencing concussion symptoms:

Headache, dizziness, fogginess, nausea, and/or other symptoms

Healthcare provider conducts necessary assessments:

Neurocognitive (ImPACT), balance (BESS), vision (VOMS), cervical spine evaluation

Patient may be referred for rehabilitation including:

Vestibular, Cognitive, Vision, Balance
